* Community Groups

Community Groups are small groups of approximately six married couples or eight individuals of the same gender that meet weekly in someone's home for fellowship, Bible study, and prayer. They are for adults of all ages and stages of life regardless of spiritual maturity, and provide participants an opportunity to grow in their relationship with God and with one another.

Connect: The primary way to join a community group is to attend GroupLink. GroupLink is a two-hour event where you will connect with others and form a community group. We don't place you in a group; you attend and choose your own. Community groups that form at GroupLink initially commit to meet for eight weeks as a "starter group." After those first eight weeks, the group members decide if they want to continue meeting together for an additional 16-22 months.

Volunteer: A *community group leader* possesses the spiritual maturity and leadership necessary to lead others as they pursue a growing relationship with Jesus Christ. An *assimilator* informs group seekers about upcoming GroupLinks and helps them connect and form community groups during the event.

InsideOut is the Sunday afternoon environment for high school students (9th–12th grade) that focuses on seeing God build us from the inside out! Fusion | *Singles*

Fusion is an environment where single adults come to build authentic friendships and get connected. Fusion cycles occur three times a year and Fusion groups connect five times over the course of each cycle in various locations around the metro Atlanta area.
