

HOST TEAM CAPTAIN SERVICE RESPONSIBILITIES

Captain must be a church member
Two year commitment

- Display enthusiasm, positive attitude, energy and Christ-like spirit to lead a team of volunteers to warmly serve others –Value your volunteers
- Stress the kind of service from members that will “lead people into a growing relationship with Jesus Christ”
- Be consistent and on time; make leading the Host Team on its designated day a priority
- Be informed of and supportive of correct procedures and encourage your team members to follow the standards of service
- Choose Co-Captains that have the same qualifications as above
- Have a share and prayer time with your team before leaving for duty
Ask if anyone “has a burden or praise they would like to share.” This avoids the “my neighbor’s uncle’s niece is sick” kind of prayer
- Communicate with your team members a minimum of two times per month (via mail, e-mail, phone tree, etc.) Convey your appreciation for them
- Enlist others on your team to help you with communication, prayer and care ministry of the team
- Commit to attend Captains/Co-Captains meetings and make sure your team members have attended training sessions
- Develop new apprentices within the team as future Host leaders
- As the Host Team functions as a “Fellowship Group,” form Community Groups from within your team
- Be accountable and responsible for your position to your God, your church and your team members
